A Muslim Perspective: November 9 at Highland Presbyterian Church

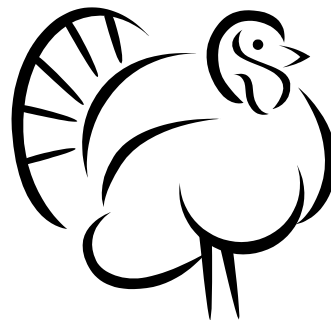
Where: Session Room, Pleune-Mobley Center at Highland Presbyterian Church located at 969 Cherokee Rd. Use side or rear entrances.

Lott's Creek

We are now collecting Christmas presents for the 300 children of Lott's Creek Community School located in Eastern KY. This school is unique because it is located on a mountaintop 7 miles outside of Hazard, KY. The families are extremely poor and it is difficult to find work in this area since the coal mines have shut down over the

education if it weren't for Lott's Creek School. The school is privately funded and is located close to the children's "hollers." The buses know their way up into the hollers in order to retrieve the children. The rugged terrain and location of the homes would make it impossible for children to drive 7 miles into Hazard day in and day out for school. The Christmas present drive, which we do just about every year, brings a small gift to each child who would otherwise not have a present to open. We are collecting 150 coloring books and crayons, 150 matchbox cars and 150 small dolls. Any gently used toys are

collected as well. Please drop your gifts off in the box marked Lott's Creek, located in the Family Life Center. Thank you again for supporting this effort. Alice Whitaker is enthusiastically looking forward to a visit to our church on December 10th to share the story of Lott's Creek.

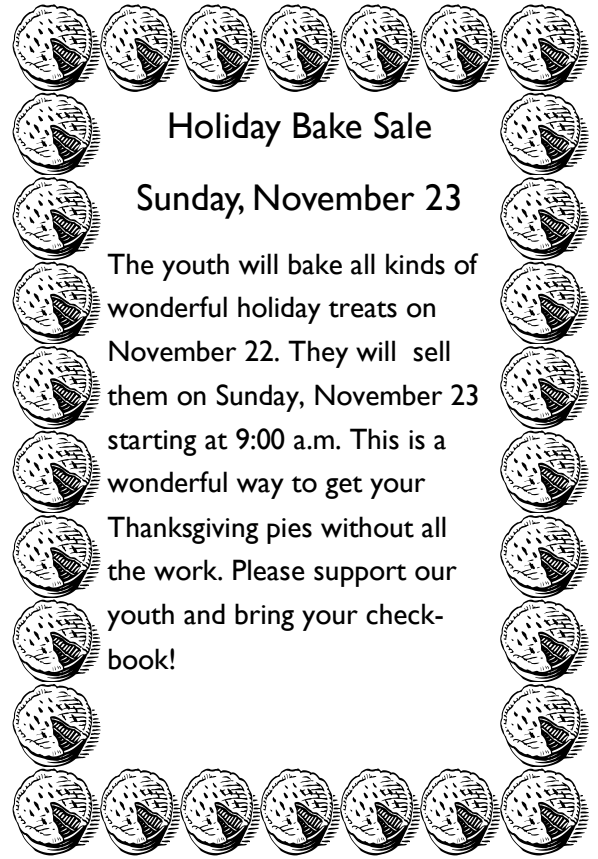
