Summer Concert—Eksteddfods

August 17, 2014 at 3:00 p.m.

The last event of the Summer Concert Season sponsored by the Pewee Valley Presbyterian Church choir is an Eisteddfod. At this time it is planned to be a "demonstration" event featuring the hypothetical winners of divisional prizes in a series of artistic events. The event is free and includes sacred music, secular music, poetry, acting, painting, and storytelling. The event is patterned after the Eisteddfods in Wales which have been a tradition for over 000 years. Ours will take place on August 17, 2014 in the Pewee Valley Presbyterian Church Family Life Center. The first group or individual will take the stage at 3:00 pm. Light refreshments will follow the program.

Sacred Music - Wayne Gilliam (St. Aloysius Music Program) - I would like to invite the choir at St. Aloysius to present three anthems.

Secular Music - Walter Anderson (Oldham County Singers) - The Singers will present three secular songs.

Poetry - Connie Vice - Connie may read her own poetry, ask others to read selected poems, have a group reading, or all of the above.

Acting - Richard Ray - Richard will get one of his many acting troupes to do a cutting of a memorable theater piece. I have also invited a troop from YPAS to do a scene from their recently completed "world tour."

Painting - The Art Association of Oldham County and others have been invited to exhibit perhaps 15 to 20 pieces of art representing as many media as possible. The art would simply be shown in and around the venue as examples of the kinds of art that could be juried in a more elaborate and realistic competition.

Storytelling - Katie Blackerby - Ms. Blackerby is an accomplished actress and knows a good story when she either hears or tells one.

A traditional Eisteddfod would take several weeks to complete since there would be juried competitions in each category, and several dance categories, not here represented, could be added. The festivals are free form events and may have as many divisions as the organizers desire. The winners may occasionally receive a monetary prize but usually receive a loving cup, inscribed to record their accomplishments, and local bragging rights.
