PENTECOST SUNDAY: May 15

On the third Sunday of this month, as recorded in scripture, we gather "all together in one place:" to celebrate the arrival of the Holy Spirit!

Historically and symbolically, Pentecost is related to the Jewish harvest festival of Shavuot, the day that is fifty days (hence its name) after the Exodus, on which God gave the Ten Commandments at Mount Sinai. In the Christian church, Pentecost now celebrates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus as described in the Book of Acts, chapter 2. Red symbolizes the "fire" of the Holy Spirit that descended from heaven like a violent wind and gave to each prophetic speech in their native tongues. So let's show our spirit in the symbolism of wearing red and live into that zeal and commitment!

PURSUING THE SALE OF OUR "CONN" PROPERTY

During the past months, our Property and Finance Teams have been looking more closely at, and having deeper discussions about, the sale of the "Conn" property located at 121 Central Avenue, beside our Parish House. This property was first purchased in 2001 as the church considered more building initiatives. It was originally thought that this would allow more access to the church property off Central Avenue. Shortly after that purchase was made, the "Inskeep" property (115 Central Avenue) became available and was purchased by the church. This purchase fulfilled the "access" needs even more effectively.

In July of 2014, as it became an increasing financial and labor liability, the Congregation voted in favor of selling the house on the Inskeep property and about an acre of land around it. With many of the same concerns about the house and other structures on the Conn Property, we anticipate that a joint recommendation from the Finance and Property Teams will come to the Session on May 9th to pursue the sale of the Conn Property. If the way be clear, we will be calling a Congregational Meeting for the purposes of presenting, discussing, and voting on this proposal.

For now, keep all involved in your thoughts and prayers as we continue to discern our stewardship of all that has been entrusted to us and the best way to follow God's Spirit leading us into the years ahead.
