Worldwide Communions and Congregational Celebrations



From the Desk of Reverend Joel Weible

This month of October brings us opportunities to gather in Spirit with brothers and sisters around the world and in body with one another on our campus for the celebrations that are filling our calendar! And it all begins around the table ...

On the first Sunday of the month, we gather in the sanctuary for World Communion Sunday, which celebrates the oneness we have in Christ with all our brothers and sisters around the world. On this Sunday we also receive the annual *Peacemaking Offering* as a way of sharing what we have with brothers and sisters in need. You may not be aware that World Communion Sunday (originally called World Wide Communion Sunday) is a gift of the Presbyterian Church to the larger ecumenical church. The first celebration occurred at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, PA, in 1933. World Communion Sunday grew out of the Division of Stewardship at Shadyside. It was their attempt to bring churches together in a service of Christian unity—in which everyone might receive both inspiration and information, and above all, to know how important the Church of Jesus Christ is, and how each congregation is interconnected one with another. The "worldwide" concept spread very slowly at the start but it was during the Second World War that the spirit caught hold, because the world was trying to hold itself together. World Wide Communion symbolized this global effort in a spiritual sense. It emphasized that we are one in the Spirit and the Gospel.

We take that Spirit of Unity into the month ahead here at PVPC with our Second Wednesday Dinner and Fellowship (at Chili's restaurant – look for the article), our semi-annual Fish Fry, the beginning of our own Stewardship Season, the Annual PV Women's Club Arts and Crafts Festival here on our campus, and our time at Friendship Manor. This month is a "microcosm" of the celebration and joy that is ours

Lott's Creek - School Supplies Drive

Thank you very much for your donations this past summer of food, clothing, and money to fill the pantry of Lott's Creek. Alice Whitaker reported that they were able to pay the God's Pantry bill with the generous donations and fill the pantry with food. Our church stepped up at a time when the need was great and they cannot thank you enough.

We are now collecting school supplies for the children of Lott's Creek Community School. We will deliver them the first of October. The need continues to be great due to the fact that they lost a huge grant. They always need food and clothing as well.

We are collecting backpacks, new or gently used, paper, crayons, markers, pencils, notebooks, scissors and glue sticks for K-12, which consists of 300 students.

The floods that hit Johnson County also devastated many counties throughout Eastern KY at the end of June. Not only are there very few good paying jobs, they continue to fight against Mountaintop Removal (a way of stripping coal by blowing off the top of the mountain). Mountaintop removal is coming closer to Lott's Creek.

Lott's Creek Community Schools (aka Cordia School) founded in 1934, by Alice Slone, provides an education K-12 for the children of the mountains in Knott County Kentucky, 6 miles outside of Hazard. The terrain is rough and many children live up in tiny hollows with dirt roads. The school offers them an education they otherwise would not be able to receive, ninety nine percent of the students go on to 4 year colleges and receive scholarships through Lott's Creek.

The folks of Lott's Creek are always thankful, grateful and humbly thank you for your continuous support of their mountaintop community.
