

## MINUTES OF SESSION

Pewee Valley Nov. 19th 1866  
4 O'clock P.M.

The Louisville Presbytery having appointed Rev. J. L. McKee D.D., Rev. Jas. Lapsley, and Elder J. B. Kinkaid as a committee to visit this place and see whether the way was clear to organize a church; and public notice having been given of a meeting at this time for that purpose, the congregation met at the time appointed.

The meeting having been opened by singing and prayer, the moderator, Rev. J. L. McKee D.D. stated the object had in view in calling the meeting; and the desire for an organization being unanimous he announced that the reception of letters was in order. Whereupon the following were presented, viz: Alexander Craig, Mrs. Anna McCown Craig, Mrs. Julia C. Rherer, Miss Julia C. Rherer, Mrs. Sarah P. McKee, Mrs. Sarah H. McKee, from the Chestnut Street Church of Louisville - Chas. B. Cotton and Mrs. Jennie Cotton from 2nd Presbyterian Church of Louisville - Thos. P. Barclay Elder, and Mrs. Louisa R. Barclay from the Bowling Green Church - and Miss Jeannette Mitchell from the Established Church of Scotland.

The congregation then proceeded to the election of elders. The vote resulted in the election of Thos. P. Barclay and Chas. B. Cotton. After a few remarks from the moderator as to the nature of the duties of ruling elder, the two persons elected signified their acceptance of the office, and Mr. Cotton was ordained, Mr. Barclay having previously ordained elder of the church at Bowling Green. The election of deacons was postponed. Alexander Craig, Jonas H. Rherer and Wm. D. Gallagher were elected trustees. Several names for the organization having been suggested the vote was taken and resulted in the choice of Presbyterian Church of Pewee Valley. After singing and prayer the meeting was dismissed with benediction.

At a meeting of the session of the Pres. Church of Pewee Valley held in the Rollington Methodist Church Monday, Nov. 1866. Rev. J. L. McKee moderating, present C. B. Cotton and T. P. Barclay elders - Session was opened by prayer. T. P. Barclay was chosen clerk of session, and appointed to represent the church at the next meeting of the Synod of Kentucky to be held in Lexington Nov. ,1866. Session closed with prayer. T. P. Dec. ,1866

Session met at the residence of Rev. J. L. McKee and was opened with prayer, Mrs. M. W. M. Allen presented her letter of dismission the Presbyterian Church at Glasgow and was received into full membership in this Church. Session closed with prayer. T. P. Barclay, Clerk

Pewee Valley Oct. 8, 1867

Session met at the home of Mr. C. B. Cotton. Opened with prayer, and moderated Dr. J. L. McKee. On motion T. P. Barclay was appointed delegate to Synod to meet in Covington Oct. 9, 1867.

The clerk was instructed to write to Rev. B. H. McCown and invite him to be present and preach the sermon at the dedication of our new house of worship.

He was also instructed to examine the various kinds of singing books used for Sunday Schools and select such as he might think best suited to our use. Session closed with prayer. T. P. Barclay, Clk.
