

Sanctuary and old Educational Building


Imagine the charming setting of Pewee Valley in the 1860's. In that rural village a group of people, eager to share the traditions of Presbyterian worship, established Pewee Valley Presbyterian Church and dedicated our present sanctuary on November 21, 1867.






As we grew into the 1900's our expanding church family created the need for additional classroom and fellowship space. In 1954 we opened our Educational Building.

In 1996, now part of the fastest-growing county in Kentucky, Pewee Valley Presbyterian built a 23,000 sq. ft. Family Life and Educational Center. The entire community now benefits from our active programs in recreation, fitness and fellowship, as well as a full-time Christian-based Child Development Center.

Our vision has always been the lifeblood of our church. Never wanting to become static in a rapidly-changing world, we have met the needs of our growing community while remaining loyal to our mission, as adopted by the congregation of Pewee Valley Presbyterian church, stating:



Our Commitment

Deuteronomy 16:17;

"Each person is to bring and give as he is able in proportion to the blessing that the Lord our God has given him."

Today we face the challenge, much as our founders did, of building additional worship space. The path to realize our vision includes:

- † Satisfying our current financial obligation for the Family Life and Educational Center, and
- † Creating a monetary foundation for additional worship space.

We hope to accomplish this by our church families committing to a three-year pledge. This pledge is in addition to our normal giving which goes to continuing and growing operating expense. We know this will mean some sacrifice, as others before us have done.

To help you determine what your level of giving may be, we have provided the table below. To reach our goal, every member is asked to give prayerful consideration to pledging 4% of total household income each year for three years. Whatever the level of your gift, it is gratefully received.

Alternative Giving Suggestions

Many of you who intend to support the Building Fund Campaign may want to pledge more than you can comfortably give from income. You may have unique financial or tax considerations that could affect your pledge. You may own some assets that you may want to donate to the church.

Your pledge does not have to be paid in cash. Pewee Valley Presbyterian Church will accept special contributions such as stocks or bonds and real property. Where assets have increased in value, by making a gift of them to the church, the donor can avoid payment of capital gains tax on the assets and receive a charitable deduction for the gift at the appreciated value. This can be a real tax savings which can be passed on to the church.



While we will always use our present sanctuary for the worship of God, it has become apparent that this lovely worship space will not accommodate the increasing membership and the visitors of the church. This is a good kind of problem for us to have. It is as though Christ is saying, "well done, good and faithful servants, you have been faithful in a few things, I will give you charge of many things." (Matthew 25:21)

The challenge we face can be stated in negative and positive terms. Negatively, we will be turning people away from the church, if we do not plan for and build new worship space. Positively, we will be committing to growth in membership and service, if we do plan for and build new worship space. The time for this has arrived. It is not something that is "off in the future." The hour has come, and we are being called by God to respond. I urge the officers, members, and friends of the congregation to step forward into this new opportunity. Join me in committing to make new worship space the goal toward which we work through this capital fund campaign.
