With apologies to Shakespeare and Henry V, this month I set our stage for yet another Lenten journey as a community of faith. Every mid-winter into Spring the church embarks on a time that is supposed to be set aside for discernment and contemplation: Who are we? Who is God calling us to be? And, having responded to those questions, what's next? The season we call Lent is modeled on Jesus' own time immediately after his baptism asking exactly these questions – his Wilderness experience.

This year our Lenten theme is *Wilderness*. Once again we will be guided by *A Sanctified Art*. Lent begins in the wilderness, we are reminded. As the Spirit guided Jesus, himself, into the wilderness, we are invited to surrender to the leadings of that same Spirit during this time. We rarely enter our "wilderness" or the Lenten season with as much intention or attention as we should. I've learned in a decade and a half, that I can't do much about your *attention*. But I can do a lot with our *intention*.

This season we *intend* to ask the questions that Jesus asked himself. His Spirit-led responses set a trajectory for his life that changed the world. Time will tell what effect our own responses will have – on our own life as a faith community or the world's. But it is a seasonal, biblical, and faithful journey we undertake once again. Read on through this month's newsletter and discover how many times you actually read or are encouraged to consider *what's next*. It's a question we will be engaging and responding to as a congregation this year. The Spirit will lead us, so we can't be sure where we will wind up. But if it is the Spirit of God we are listening to, we can be sure we will be on the right path.

Last month, on the four Sundays during worship, we introduced ourselves - theologically and practically - to what an intergenerational worshiping community might look like at PVPC. We removed two pews, laid a padded floor, placed kneeling pillows, and furnished a space specifically designed for the children and their families that are coming to worship here with all others who gather. Each week we taught them and reminded ourselves what, when, and why we do what we do during our time of worship. And we then invited them to participate in tangible, age-appropriate ways, expressing their prayers, affirming their faith and sharing their song along with the rest of the gathered community.

As we settle into the six-month "pilot" ministry, guided by the Christian Formation Team and our Session, we trust and continue to pray that this space and those who fill it on Sunday morning will become a welcomed part of everything else we do whenever we gather to worship God.

We are deeply grateful to those who have led us to this point. And we are thankful to each and every one of you who have remained and remain open to the new thing that is happening in our midst. Our Lenten Journey 2024

Lent begins and ends in the wilderness. The Spirit guides Jesus into the wilderness where he comes face to face with temptation and struggle. Yet, in his forty days of fasting, resisting, and wandering, Jesus is shaped and formed for ministry.

Similarly, through the wilderness of Lent, we are invited to surrender to the wild leadings of the Spirit. We rarely enter the wilderness willingly, but hopefully through our wandering we remember who we are and whose we are. The wilderness can become sacred even if it remains dangerous. There is no wilderness space too harsh or threatening for God's love.

This Lent, we welcome you to the journey. As we enter our sanctuary for the worship services of Lent, from Ash Wednesday through six Sundays and Maundy Thursday, we will be stepping into the *Wilderness* to be led by the sprit of God, gentle and restless. Through liturgy, prayers, sermon, scripture, and song we will find ourselves shaped and formed for Easter morning and all that lies beyond.
