I am almost certain that I'm the only one who will get the "scriptural allusion" in my monthly entry in our Cornerstone newsletter, so allow me to explain:

In the gospel of Matthew, Jesus "foretells" his death and resurrection three times, each time ending his prediction with "and on the third day (he will be raised)." Mark and Luke write similar predictions. On that first Easter Day, Matthew says that "Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to the tomb" on the "first day of the week." So my titular allusion is taking us to the "last day of this month" which, this year is ... (Are you with me now?) ... *Easter Sunday!* The day Jesus foretold. The day the women in Matthew found the tomb empty. The day a new faith was birthed.

The last day of this month is the first Sunday after the first full moon, after the Spring equinox. Easter can fall on any Sunday between March 22 and April 25, so it's pretty early this year.



We look forward to all that will happen in the weeks ahead. *And on the last day of the month*, we will gather for the best news of all. Join us in all the conversations going on as we move forward to new life. You know the easiest way to get started ...

This Lent, we welcome you to the journey. As we enter our sanctuary for the worship services of Lent, from Ash Wednesday through six Sundays and Maundy Thursday, we will be stepping into the *Wilderness* to be led by the sprit of God, gentle and restless. Through liturgy, prayers, sermon, scripture, and song we will find ourselves shaped and formed for Easter morning and all that lies beyond.

An update from your Christian Formation Team

In December, Session approved a six month pilot ministry intended to welcome families more fully and engage children in the worship experience of PVPC. Even before January of this year, Ashia Stoess, our Director of Family Ministry and Community Engagement, was communicating with the families that are already attending to let them know the "where, what and why" of this ministry. All of them were excited about the space.

In January of this year, we spent a lot of time communicating with the entire congregation through newsletter articles and most directly during the Sacred Space time for young disciples during our worship hour. As Ashia and the Launch Team spoke to the children who were in worship, they spoke to us all – educating us and "stepping" the space into existence during the month. Through February, the families who attend have been worshipping together in this space and, with Ashia and Jackie Meade's guidance, have been participating in age appropriate ways, using the "Worship Toolboxes" we have provided.

We have been documenting your responses – critical and supportive – and find the constructive feedback most helpful in discerning if, and how, we can improve and normalize this ministry in the worshipping life of PVPC. So let us know how you feel about what's going on in our midst by emailing, calling, or best yet...speaking to an Elder or Staff member.

Thank you PVPC for your patience, your guidance, your wisdom and your faith in this challenging endeavor. We'll continue to "keep you up to date" in the months ahead.

2024 ANNUAL ELDER RETREAT REPORT

On Saturday, February 10th, your Elders gathered together for the Annual Elder Retreat in our own Parish House from 9:00a – 3:00p.

In March of 2023, we received a Mid-Kentucky Presbytery *Demonstration Project Grant*, awarded for "projects or programs designed to generate long lasting growth in membership and/or participation that may be replicated in other churches with a higher level of confidence of success." Our project was (and still is!) *Congregational Vitality through Community Engagement*. To date we have received \$30,000 of the total possible \$50,000. We have used this money to help fund a staff position created even before we received the grant, budgets for that new office and a new Ministry Team, as well as Christian Formation materials and Community Engagement activities. It remains for us to apply for and, if the way be clear, receive the final \$20,000. And the potential use of this money was the focus of our Elder Retreat this year.

Using *Mission Possible: Design Thinking for Social Change*, a game from Rooted Good designed to help faith-based organizations to align money with mission, your Elders took "seemingly impossible tasks" and created a possible solutions. We learned to think "outside the box" and were equipped to think creatively about the issues we face and to ask what next? Then, using *What Next?*, a tool from the same group and the PCUS Office of Christian Formation designed to help us re-imagine our ministries and life together, we set out to figure out what we thought could be "next" in our Congregational Vitality initiative and how we might faithfully use the final disbursement of our Grant monies to help fund it!

We are excited to share what we discerned and to see how it aligns with the wider community's energy and ideas. We will be doing that in April around a dinner table or two! In the meantime, pull an Elder aside and thank them for the extra time and discernment they give to all of us in their service on Session.
